


**Triangle School Vacation Internships**


In our Triangle Pre-ETS classes, the concept of the dignity of work is taught and instilled as a core foundation. The earning of an internship is the capstone of a student's learning. Seven students participated in internships over school vacation week. Four students worked performing environmental maintenance and three students worked in light manufacturing. All students were trained in how to work and function under COVID conditions, in addition to experiencing standard working procedure such as traveling to work, recording of work hours, and the tasks relative to their project. When asked to reflect on their experiences the students shared: "I enjoyed learning new things"... "I really enjoy using the equipment"... "I enjoy working in the studio."

We are proud of the students for choosing to apply, interviewing, accepting the job, and showing up for work.



# **Environmental Services Internships**

"We have taken the next step in the development of our skills training services at Triangle. During April vacation we hosted, 4 Pre-ETS interns for a Work-Based Learning Experience to support our Environmental Services program. 

Gregory Walther from the Employment Collaborative and Krystel Love from MassHire Brockton presented Summer Youth Jobs program to Pre-ETS students on zoom. They discussed the many opportunities that these jobs offer. MassHire Brockton provides funds that communities use to pay wages to low-income youth for summer jobs. The primary component of the YouthWorks program is to subsidize employment at a public or nonprofit agencies, departments, and authorities. Participants are employed up to 25 hours per week over a six-week period during the summer component (as early as June and ending as late as September) Hourly wages are required to be no less than the Massachusetts minimum wage.

May

IMPACT for Young Men: May 6th, May 13th, May 20th Time: 3:30 - 4:30pm

IMPACT for Young Women: May 3rd, May 10th, May 17th Time: 3:30 - 4:30pm

Join Triangle for a relevant Pre-ETS experience. Students will be taught relationship skills by industry leader IMPACT. The three-part training series will cover building healthy relationships, assertive communication, training on behavior in certain social situations, the impact of gender socialization and advocacy skills. By the end of the training, students will have a clearer vision of how to take control of their lives and care for themselves as they mature and prepare for life after high school. Triangle will offer this training in two parts. One training for young women and the other for young men.

June

Financial Literacy Training: June 2nd, June 9th, June 16th, June 23rd Time: 3:30 - 4:30pm

Students have spent the year learning valuable soft skills in preparation for the working world during Work Readiness Training. Others have taken a journey through Job Exploration Counseling. Some have learned self-advocacy skills and others, skills necessary for success in higher education during the Counseling in Post-Secondary Education unit. Work Based Learning Experiences have been offered remotely each month, where students are exposed to different careers. All training components were meant to empower students and make them more independent while preparing for future jobs. Our hope is that through employment, students move on to live independent, full lives. In June, Triangle will teach financial literacy to further prepare students for the working world and provide another opportunity to grow and gain independence.
