Triangle Internships:

Rockland High School Light Manufacturing Internships

Rockland High School students participated in a light manufacturing internship. They assembled travelling kits. This is a multi-step process that requires focus and the ability to follow directions. Ms. Kirby, their teacher, supervised them to ensure that the finished product met quality standards.

During this internship, students experienced the dignity of work. Furthermore, all students were trained in how to work and function under COVID



conditions, in addition to experiencing standard working procedure such as traveling to work, recording of work hours, and the tasks relative to their project.

Work Readiness & Job Exploration Counseling Classes in Spanish

Over the year, Triangle provided school/ class specific trainings, as well as small, medium, and large group cohorts. Triangle also offered 1-on-1 Pre-ETS for students throughout the year. Some students needed extra support, some struggled with the new remote training platform, some needed training in their first language.


We shout out all students who participated this year, whether in a group from school, those who chose to join us after school alongside peers from around the state, or those that advocated for and took part in 1-on-1 training.

Financial Literacy Class Brings It All Together

Students have spent the year learning valuable soft skills in preparation for the working world during Work Readiness Training. Others have taken a journey through Job Exploration Counseling. Some have learned self-advocacy skills and others, skills necessary for success in higher education during the Counseling in Post-Secondary Education unit. Work-Based Learning Experiences have been offered remotely each month, where students are exposed to different careers. All training components were meant to empower students and make them more independent while preparing for future jobs. Our hope is that through employment, students move on to live independent, full lives.


In June, Triangle taught financial literacy to further prepare students for the working world and provide another opportunity to grow and gain independence. Students learned about the language of money, assessed their own income, and explored their future savings. The final class taught students what a credit score is, how to check their credit scores, and how to maintain a good credit profile.
